This report contains cumulative private school and student statistics through the September, November, and February payment periods of the 2005-2006 school year.

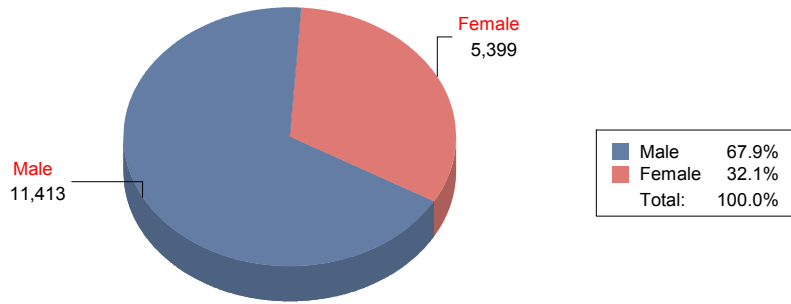

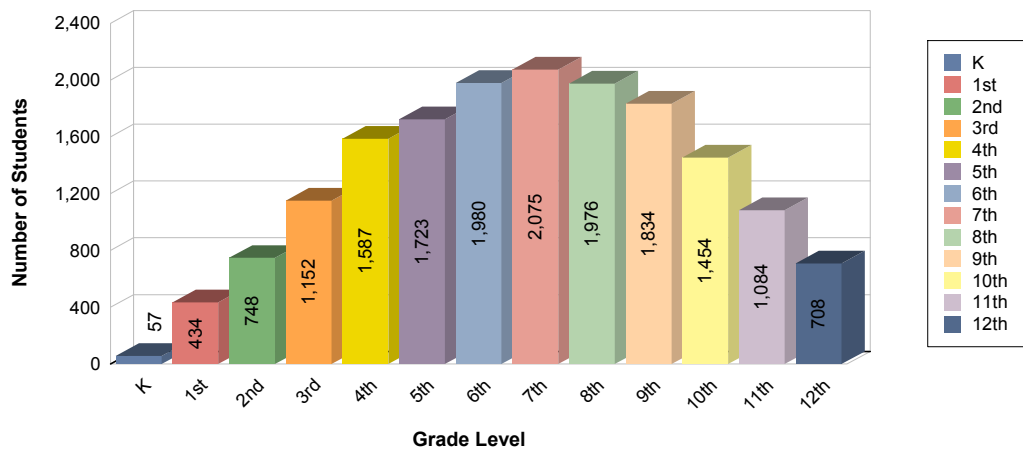

McKay Students Enrollment by Gender



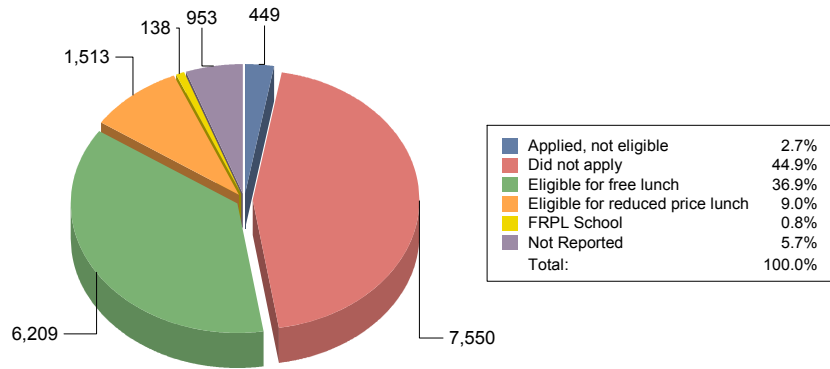

McKay Students Enrollment by Grade Level



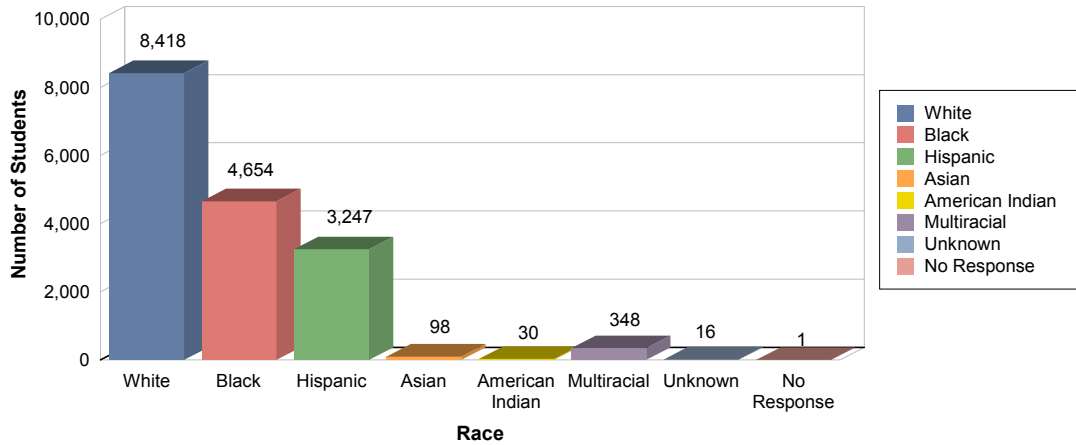

McKay Students Eligible for Free and Reduced-Price Lunch (FRPL)



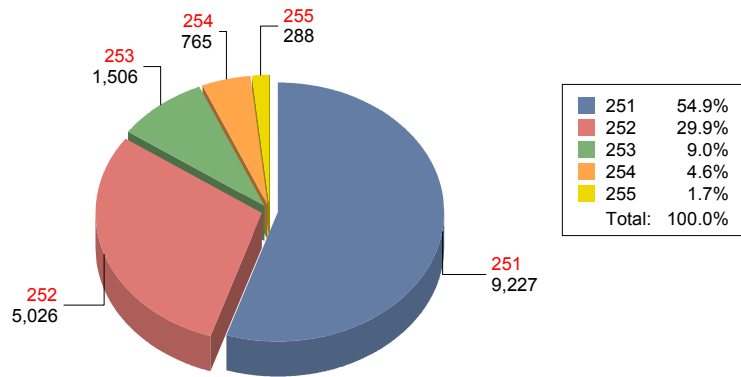

McKay Students Racial/Ethnic Enrollment



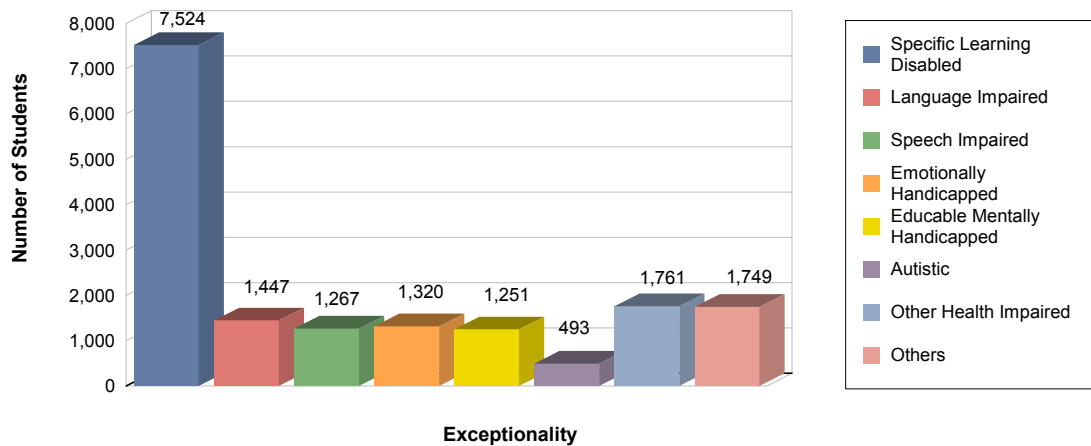

McKay Students by Matrix



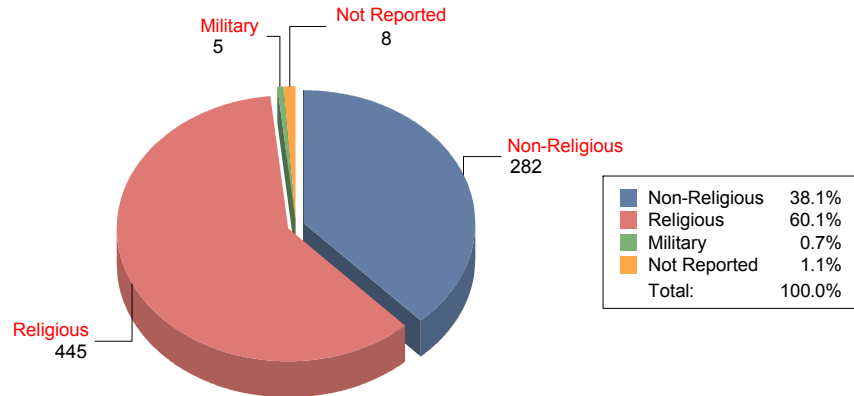

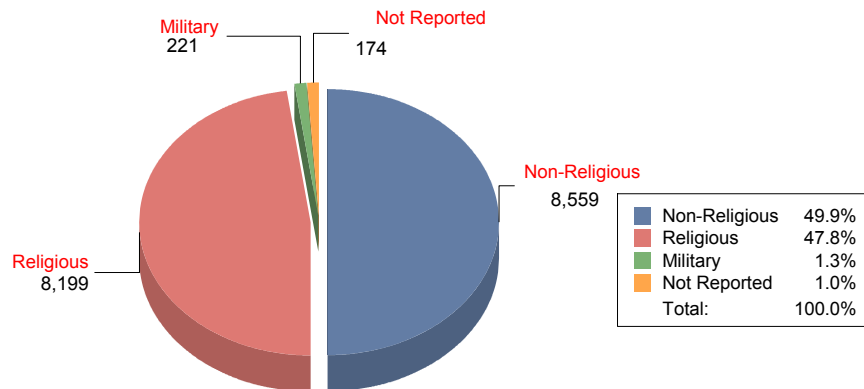
