Compliance Issues - May 1st

Renewing private schools that met the Scholarship Compliance Form submission deadline of March 1 must resolve any outstanding compliance issues by May 1, 2016, in order to remain eligible to participate in the state scholarship programs for the 2016-17 school year. This means all documentation must be received by our office on or before May 1. Schools having unresolved issues after May 1 will not be able to participate in the McKay or FTC Scholarship Programs for the upcoming school year. Please contact your regional manager promptly if you have any questions.

Required Student Records

In addition to meeting health and safety requirements for their physical location, all Florida private schools must complete and retain certain student records. Enrollment records must be compiled, including school entry health examination and immunization records. Attendance records must be maintained showing that students meet the compulsory attendance requirements established in Florida law and State Board Rule. If your school is selected for a site visit, staff members from our office will review these student records. Additionally, should your school close, you will be required to transfer all permanent information included in student records to the public school district. Intent filing deadline for the September 1 payment.

Enrollment deadline for the September 1 payment.
