



Annual Survey

The 2017 Annual Survey of Private Schools is now available online. By law, all private schools in Florida are required to submit the Annual Survey. It is also a requirement for participation in the state scholarship programs and must be completed as part of the Compliance process. To submit the survey, log into our website as a private school, complete the information and submit it online. The survey must also be printed, signed by the owner/chief administrative officer, notarized and mailed to our office.

By submitting the survey, your school will be included in the private school directory available on our website, your students will be able to qualify for a Bright Futures Scholarship, and you will receive updates from our office on federal initiatives and other issues affecting private schools.

Please complete this important requirement promptly.

Fingerprint Retention Requirement

Private schools participating in state scholarship programs must ensure that all staff having contact with students pass a Level 2 background check through FDLE, and retain staff fingerprints in the Applicant Fingerprint Retention Notification Program (AFRNP).

FDLE sends invoices to private schools monthly for the retention of fingerprints in their database. Invoices must be paid as soon as possible. If the invoice is not paid, the prints are deleted from the AFRNP. Once fingerprints are deleted, they cannot be retrieved. To be in compliance with the law, your school employees will have to again submit their fingerprints for state and national checks and for retention; and an additional fee will be assessed.

Regular Student Attendance

Remember that private school students participating in the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship, McKay Scholarship, and Gardiner Scholarship Programs must have regular and direct contact with their private school teachers at your school's physical location. That means your school must provide a program of instruction that meets for a minimum of 170 actual school instruction days with the instructional hours required for each grade level.

Legislation passed last year allows private schools to establish a transition-to-work program for high school students participating in the McKay Scholarship Program which allows students to earn high school credits while working off-site. For more information on Transition to Work programs, contact your regional manager.

FTC Norm-Referenced Testing

Private schools participating in the Florida Tax Credit (FTC) or Gardiner Scholarship Programs must make provisions for scholarship students in grades 3-10 to take one of the nationally norm-referenced tests identified by the Department of Education.
