2021 Annual Private School Survey

The 2021 Annual Survey of Private Schools is now available online! By law, all private schools in Florida are required to submit the Annual Survey. It is also a requirement for participation in the state scholarship programs and must be completed as part of the Compliance process. To submit the survey, log into our website as a private school, complete school's information and submit it online. The survey must also be printed, signed by the owner/chief administrative officer, notarized, and mailed to our office.

By submitting the survey, your school will be included in the private school directory available on our website, your students will be able to qualify for a Bright Futures Scholarship, and you will receive updates from our office on federal initiatives and other issues affecting private schools.

Please complete this important requirement promptly.

Changing Location?

If your school expanded to an additional location, or relocated over the summer, don't forget to alert our office. Be sure to have all applicable inspections completed before students attend your new location. Avoid delays in scholarship payments--submit an Update Notification Form to inform our office of your move, and provide the necessary documentation as soon as possible.

Employment Screening

Private schools accepting state scholarship students must conduct employment history checks for new personnel and use the Bureau of Educator Certification as well as the Professional Practices Database screening tools available through our website.

Be sure to complete the screening before new employees begin to work with students, and remember to document the findings. This employment screening process is in addition to the Level II criminal background screening obtained through the VECHS program. Contact your Regional Manager if you have questions about either process.



Fingerprint Retention Requirement

Private schools participating in state scholarship programs must ensure that all staff having contact with students pass a Level 2 background check through FDLE and retain staff fingerprints in the **FALCON** system. By obtaining report data on fingerprints retained in FALCON, users can determine through provided reports which specific individual fingerprints were deleted and other information that will be useful to their organization. Regular Student Attendance

Remember that private school students participating in the state scholarship programs must have regular and direct contact with their private school teachers at your school's physical location. That means your school must provide a program of instruction that meets for a minimum of 170 actual school instruction days with the instructional hours required for each grade level.

Transition To Work Program

Previous legislation passed allows private schools to establish a Transition To Work program for high school students participating in the McKay Scholarship Program which allows students to earn high school credits while working off-site. Norm-Referenced Testing

Private schools participating in the Florida Tax Credit (FTC), Hope Scholarship, or Family Empowerment Scholarship Programs must make provisions for scholarship students in grades 3-10 to take one of the nationally norm-referenced tests identified by the Department of Education.
