This is the eighth in a series of monthly State Performance Plan (SPP) indicator resources to assist districts in identifying additional supports. This month, secondary transition Indicator 2 - Dropout is highlighted.

Students with and without disabilities who are at risk of dropping out of school show signs of being at risk as early as elementary school. Identifying and tracking dropout warning signs is one way of determining potential dropouts in order to provide additional student support. The National High School Center (NHSC) has developed an Early Warning System tool and support materials, which are available on its Web site. The Webinar, "What Matters for Staying On-Track and Graduating in Chicago Public Schools: A Focus on Students with Disabilities," was broadcast December 8, 2009, and the Webinar recording and presentation slides discuss research conducted in the Chicago Public Schools and use of the early warning system tool. Proposed State Board Rules

The Department of Education has continued to develop State Board Rules to implement and clarify statutory requirements for charter schools and sponsors. The rules listed below have been proposed for adoption next month. Charter schools and sponsors must comply with the procedures established by each rule; therefore, it is important to become familiar with the new requirements. The Department will also provide technical assistance following the adoption of the rules.

Rules currently proposed for adoption:

6A-1.0081 Charter School Financial Conditions – This rule establishes procedures for developing financial recovery and corrective action plans, defines and establishes procedures for determining a deteriorating financial condition, and adopts a standard format for the monthly financial statement a charter school must submit to its sponsor. The proposed text of the rule is available in the January 15, 2010, edition of the <u>Florida Administrative Weekly</u>.

6A-6.0785 Charter School Training Standards – This rule codifies the department's training standards, establishes a procedure by which sponsors may require charter applicants to attend training provided by the sponsor in lieu of the training provided by the department, and establishes notification requirements regarding the required training. The proposed text of the rule is available on the <u>School Choice Web site</u>.

6A-6.0788 Notice Requirements for Charter School Performance Data – This rule establishes notice requirements for certain charter schools who must report student performance data on their Web site and to the public at large. The proposed text of the rule is available on the <u>School Choice Web site</u>.

The State Board of Education will vote to adopt these proposed rules on March 16, 2010. More information about this meeting is available at http://www.fldoe.org/board/meetings/.
