National Charter School Teachers' Institute

A National Charter School Teachers' Institute hosted by the U.S. Department of Education is being held June 21, 2009, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. at the Washington Convention Center, free of charge, prior to the national conference. Space is limited to 500 attendees.

Prominent teacher leaders from around the country will provide 60 training sessions and share research-based practices they have successfully applied in their classrooms and schools. Participants will discuss instructional strategies in each content area and for each grade level. Content focus for the sessions will include: reading, math, science, English language leaders, history, using data, differentiating instruction, and technology to support student achievement. Sessions will also provide important resources from the National Math Panel, the National Archives, and the Library of Congress.
