Merit Award Program

Charter schools with a Merit Award Program (MAP) plan in place for the 2007-08 school year may wish to utilize the exams available through the End-of-Course Exam (ECE) Clearinghouse. Even if your district does not have a MAP plan for this year, you may request access to available tests through your district ECE Clearinghouse contact.

There are currently 703 exams available. Sort and filter applications have been provided by Hillsborough County staff to help users locate appropriate exams. Charter school administrators may go to http://www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/ and select ECE Clearinghouse from Quick Links to search for exam titles.

Participation in the Merit Award Program requires schools to administer end-of-course examinations based on state academic standards for all grade groupings and subjects. To maintain the integrity of the exams contributed to the ECE Clearinghouse, access is regulated by detailed security procedures. We encourage you to request the exams your school needs to meet MAP requirements as soon as possible from your district ECE Clearinghouse Contact. Florida Virtual School Launches New and Improved AP Reviews

Students throughout Florida planning to take Advanced Placement (AP) Exams can prepare using an online AP Review. The Web-based tool features multiple choice assessments in a self-paced, interactive environment. The AP Reviews will arm students with resources and practice tests developed from previously released AP examinations and materials licensed by the College Board. The test reviews are offered free of charge to all students and are available for the following AP courses: Art History, Biology; Calculus AB; English Language (new tutorial); English Literature; Government and Politics;

Macroeconomics; Spanish (new tutorial); U.S. History; and European History. Students currently enrolled in Florida Virtual School (FLVS) AP courses are pre-registered for the AP Review that corresponds with their AP course; a link to the review is embedded in their course content. Students not currently enrolled in FLVS courses can register for the AP Reviews by going to <u>http://</u> aptestreview.flvs.net.
