## Blended and Online Learning and Teaching (BOLT) Program

The Florida State University (FSU) College of Education is pleased to announce its new Blended and Online Learning and Teaching (BOLT) program for both undergraduate and graduate students. BOLT specifically addresses the United States Department of Education's (USDOE) call to improve digital learning in our nation's elementary and secondary schools. BOLT is designed to provide an online education to K-12 teachers and administrators to use online and blended instruction effectively in their classrooms and schools.



Four online courses provide current and future teachers and administrators with the advanced knowledge, skills, and abilities that are necessary for effective K-12 e-learning and e-teaching. America's education system is transforming rapidly, so be one of the first to become a "certified" online teacher by participating in the certificate program. This program begins summer 2011.

### **Required Courses**

Foundations of Blended and Online Learning and Teaching (EDF 5935-02) 3 credit hours, summer 2011 semester

Pedagogy of Blended and Online Learning and Teaching (TBA) 3 credit hours, fall 2011 semester Technologies for Blended and Online Learning and Teaching (TBA) 3 credit hours, fall 2011 semester Issues, Trends, and Practices in Blended and Online Learning and Teaching (TBA) 3 credit hours, spring 2012 semester

#### **Admissions Requirements**

Students with a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution are eligible to enroll as a graduatelevel special student (non-degree seeking).

Application to both the University and the BOLT Certificate program can be completed online using the appropriate applications:

Step 2: Apply to the BOLT program by contacting the faculty program coordinator.

#### **Technology Requirements**

Students will be required to obtain an FSU e-mail account to access the course Blackboard site. In order to complete class requirements, class participants will need to be able to:

Access the Internet – this will require a high-speed, broadband connection; Be familiar with Internet Explorer or Firefox browsers or both; Download and upload document files; Download, view, and listen to PowerPoint presentations; Download and view PDF files using Acrobat Reader or similar software; Utilize Real Player or Windows Media to download, view, and listen to digital media; Download & install software plug-ins such as Adobe Reader, Real Audio, etc., and Send and receive e-mails.

The Inlet Grove High School Foundation held its 2011 Awards Gala at the Palm Beach County Convention Center on Saturday, May 14.



## Donor Gives \$1 Million for LWHS Technology



An anonymous donor's \$1 million gift to Lake Wales High School will completely change the school's technology program for next year.

When school begins Monday, August 22, 2011, every student will find a new Apple iPad on his or her desk, and every LWHS teacher will have a new iMac laptop computer. Technology infrastructure will be improved and strengthened; a STEM lab will be installed for science, technology, engineering and math; and the LWHS gymnasium will be outfitted with new audio equipment and video screens.

"The appointment of a new principal at Lake Wales High School creates a unique opportunity to transform not only the high school but the entire community," the donor said. "The time is right to maximize this opportunity by equipping the teachers and students with the latest and best technology.

"I'm optimistic that this gift will allow everyone – administrators, teachers and students – to realize their full potential. Next year will be exciting," he added. He first announced the gift March 24th during a meeting with LWHS faculty.

"This donor is keenly interested in the rapidly changing field of technology, and the impact it can have on student achievement," said Robin Gibson, chair of the Lake Wales Charter Schools Foundation. "He has been working with LWCS Foundation leaders and other volunteers to plan the campaign. This gift is a game changer for our high school and our community."

Gibson said this is the first large gift in a major four-year Capital Campaign that is under way to raise money for infrastructure and technology at LWHS, Bok Academy and the system's four elementary schools. The Capital Campaign will end in 2014, the 100th anniversary of the establishment of public schools in Lake Wales.

"Originally, this summer was intended to be our Quiet Phase for leadership gifts to the Capital Campaign," Gibson said. "But it is impossible to keep quiet about a one million dollar gift!"

School leaders are negotiating with Apple Computer for their order of 1,300 iPad2s, the latest version of the product, plus additional software, teacher laptops, and teacher training.

"We are honored to receive this gift. Our ability to transform Lake Wales High School has just skyrocketed," said Donna Dunson, who becomes LWHS principal in June. She currently is principal at Bok Academy, which has several classrooms using iPads.

"The students at Lake Wales High School have tremendous potential, and this will help them rise to a new level of achievement," Dunson said.

Teachers and support staff will have multiple opportunities this spring and summer to become proficient with the new technology. Once they complete training, LWHS teachers will get iPads and iMac laptops to use fulltime.

"We are very grateful for this gift," said Superintendent Jesse Jackson. "It demonstrates that leaders in our community recognize the hard work going on in our schools, and they are willing to step forward to support our efforts."

Other changes are taking place at Lake Wales High School before school starts next August. The exterior of the buildings has been repainted. Landscaping will be redesigned and installed this summer, thanks to two private donations that were pledged as leadership gifts for the Capital Campaign, according to Gibson.

Lake Wales High also is expanding its Career Academy programs, and planning for the introduction of the International Baccalaureate program.

"We are very grateful for this gift," said Superintendent Jesse Jackson.
