2009 Legislation Affecting Charter Schools



Senate Bill (SB) 278, related to charter schools, was passed by the 2009 Florida Legislature, signed by the Governor, and became effective July 1, 2009. The provisions of the legislation affect several areas of charter school operations including process, application reporting requirements, student assessment data, sponsor services, and financial recovery and corrective action procedures. In addition, the Department of Education plans to propose State Board of Education Rules to further clarify some of the statutory requirements for charter schools. Rule notices have been published in the July 10, 2009 issue of the Florida Administrative Weekly.


