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Title I Distinguished Schools



~ Nine schools honored with academic awards for exceptional student achievement ~

The Florida State Board of Education recognized nine Title I schools for their superior performance in raising student achievement and promoting academic progress for all students. Each of the nine schools, honored as Title I Distinguished Schools, met rigorous state and federal accountability measures for five consecutive years in order to earn the awards. Title I schools receive federal funding for low-income students.

Title I Distinguished Schools serve as models for and provide support to other Title I schools, especially those identified for improvement. These schools earned the award by meeting 100 percent of federal Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) requirements and achieving a school performance grade of "A" or "B" for five consecutive years.

Parents, overwhelmed by the college application process, signed up their offspring for English Department Chair **Nathalie Milian's** *College Planning Seminar* - a week packed full with information. Master Teacher **Dr. Susan Hildebrand** offered a *Get Rich Reading! workshop* which drew an interesting group of students seeking to enlighten themselves with action-oriented readings and discussion groups. Geared to helping students be a success in high school and life in general, the summer workshop included numerous interesting activities to increase writing skills while exploring a treasure trove of publications. Dr. Hildebrand advertised her class on the A&M website with a note: *"Come and learn lots of fun ways to ensure your success."*

Students asked for a summer session to help them raise SAT scores and gain confidence in test taking skills. Top notch Language Arts professor **Nathalie Milian's** *SAT Prep* begins August 2. Strong emphasis will be placed on both the SAT English and math sections. A&M students will be well prepared for the first SAT and/or ACT examinations which begin in the fall.

Also running for two weeks in August is A&M's *High School 101 ~ On the Plaza*. This mini-camp introduces the academic skills necessary to be successful in high school. Each day is an adventure. After an hour in the classroom, the students get to know Coconut Grove and all the "ins and outs" on the daily walking tours complete with tidbits on the village's vibrant history.
