2009 No Child Left Behind-Blue Ribbon Schools

The Department of Education would like to congratulate the City of Pembroke Pines Charter Middle School (West and Central) for being designated one of the 2009 No Child Left Behind-Blue Ribbon Schools.

The No Child Left Behind-Blue Ribbon Schools Program honors public and private elementary, middle and high schools that are either academically superior or that demonstrate dramatic gains in student achievement to high levels. The schools are selected based on one of two criteria:

Schools with at least 40 percent of their students from disadvantaged backgrounds that dramatically improve student performance to high levels on state tests; or

Schools whose students, regardless of background, achieve in the top 10 percent of their state on state tests or in the case of private schools in the top 10 percent of the nation on nationally-normed tests.

* Each state—not the federal government—sets its own academic standards and benchmark goals.

Under No Child Left Behind, schools must make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in reading (language arts) and mathematics.

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
2008-2009 Charter School Annual Accountability Report

Grandparent's Day






