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Special points of interest:

- Parents must file intent to participate in the McKay Scholarship by July 3 in order to receive the first quarterly payment.
- Participating schools must register and enroll McKay students by August 2 in order to receive the first quarterly payment.
- Districts should ensure that McKay students matriculating from elementary to middle, or from middle to high school are not automatically re-enrolled in the district.

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District Verification Deadlines for 2011-2012

District enrollment verification of students to be funded through the McKay Scholarship is an important accountability safeguard built into the program to ensure funding is appropriately distributed. The chart below displays the verification dates for the 2011-12 school year. For each payment period, the McKay student file will be available to districts via the Northwest Regional Data Center (NWRDC) site on the date listed for district review and verification, and must be submitted by the deadline in red. Once payments have been issued, the NWRDC will post the list of paid students.

District Verification File: McKay pre-payment file which is exported to districts to verify students are not enrolled in public school system. This file contains all students the DOE *intends* on paying.

District FTE File: McKay post-payment file which identifies the students who were paid for the specified payment period and who will need to be reported to generate FTE funding.

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2011 Legislative Changes

The 2011 Florida Legislative session has ended. Several bills related to scholarship programs passed both chambers. If approved by the Governor, these bills would go into effect July 1, 2011.

House Bill 797, Interscholastic and Intrascholastic Sports, would provide for a statewide program in which middle school and high school students attending certain private schools may be able to participate in athletics at a public school.

House Bill 965, Florida Tax Credit Scholarship

<u>Program</u>, would expand the amount of tax credit allowed for a contribution made to an eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization.

House Bill 1255, Public School Accountability, would revise numerous provisions relating to the K-12 public education system, and would provide an exception to McKay Scholarship ineligibility for students who enter a Department of Juvenile Justice detention center for a period of no

House Bill 1329, McKay Scholarships, would provide eligibility for program participation to students with disabilities for whom a 504 accommodation plan has been established.

Our office is working closely with the Bureau of Exceptional Education Services to develop guidance and processes that will assist school districts with implementation of HB 1329, should it be approved by the Governor. Please be watching for updates via email over the next few weeks.

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
