Prior Year in Attendance

rida law requires a student to have spent the prior school year in endance at a Florida public school in order to be eligible for a McKay olarship. "Prior school year in attendance" is defined by Section 12.39(2)(a)1., Florida Statutes, as being reported for funding in the ceding October and February Florida Education Finance Program veys. Therefore, any intent filed during the 2014-15 school year will verified by the Department against the October 2013 and February .4 FTE survey data. A student does not have to be reported for ding in the October 2014 funding survey to be eligible for the rent school year. There may be instances when a student misses the rent-year October survey count; however, the dent's eligibility is determined based on the or school year's FTE surveys and the student's sent status as a public school student with an or 504 Plan. It is the school district's ponsibility to ensure the student has an IEP or 04 Plan that is valid for more than 6 months, and to enter the propriate status within 30 days.
