2017 Legislative Session

The 2017 session of the Florida Legislature is now underway. Some of the bills that have been filed may impact state scholarship programs. Watch for updates on the outcome of session in future newsletters from our office.

Gardiner Scholarship Matrix Request

Pursuant to section 1002.385, F.S., funding for a student's Gardiner Scholarship account is initially calculated with a matrix of 253. However, scholarship parents may request a review of their student's IEP, and district personnel must complete a revised matrix of services for those students. Parents who want a matrix update must make their scholarship funding organization (SFO) aware of their request, and they must also contact the district directly. Once the parent contacts the district, the matrix must be completed within thirty days of the request. In addition to completing the matrix, districts must notify our office of a student's matrix level by logging into our website and entering the matrix using the Gardiner Student List link in the left menu. If the parent has notified their SFO that they are making a request for a matrix review, editing the matrix for the student will be enabled. McKay and Virtual School Courses

McKay Scholarship students are allowed to take up to two courses per year in a virtual school program (which includes your district's franchise of FLVS as well as district Virtual Instruction Programs) without penalty or loss of scholarship eligibility. Please note that a student's enrollment in these courses in your district does not constitute a return to public

McKay Eligibility for Pre-K

The McKay Scholarship may be awarded to eligible students beginning in their kindergarten year; however, a student may file intent and establish eligibility for the program in prekindergarten in one of two ways, pursuant to section 1002.39(2), F.S. A student must either

- have been enrolled and reported for funding during the preceding October and February FEFP surveys and have been eligible for services under <u>s. 1003.21(1)(e)</u>, <u>F.S.</u> (i.e., as a pre-k student with disabilities); or
- have received specialized instructional services under the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program pursuant to <u>s.</u>
 1002.66, F.S. during the previous school year.

In addition, the student must have an Individual Education Plan or 504 Accommodation Plan.

If intent is filed for a rising Kindergarten student prior to their Pre-K transition meeting, the district may identify the student status in the system as "Eligibility pending transition meeting." When the transition meeting is complete, the system will allow the district to assign the correct matrix number or eligibility status.

Earlier this year, the Department issued a memorandum related to the requirement for public school districts to notify parents of students with disabilities about McKay Scholarship Program options. Parental notifications must be sent by April 1st of each school year and within 10 days of an Individual Education Plan (IEP) meeting.
