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# Private School Newsletter

### Private School Annual Survey

If your school has not yet completed the Private School Annual Survey for the 2009-10 school year, please log on to the School Choice website at <u>www.floridaschoolchoice.org</u>, to complete the survey. The survey must be submitted by mail, **postmarked no later than May 1, 2010**. Completing a Private School Annual Survey is a requirement outlined in Section 1002.42(2)(b), Florida Statutes.

Private schools that do not complete and submit a current Private School Annual Survey by mail, postmarked by the May 1 deadline, will be removed from the Private School Directory and will not be able to be listed again until a 2010-2011 Private School Annual Survey is completed and submitted by mail. The 2010-2011 Private School Annual Survey will be available September 1, 2010.

Removal of your listing in the directory may affect your school's ability to participate in other state and federal programs such as the Bright Future's Scholarship Program or the National School Lunch Program.

To verify that the Department has received your survey, please login as a private school administrator on the School Choice website. Under *Step One: Annual Private School Survey* a date will appear after the bolded text stating "Hard-Copy Received." If there is no date, the Department has not received the signed, hard-copy of the survey.

### **Closing Requirements**

Florida law requires all private schools that close to notify the Department of Education of the date of transfer of student records, the location of storage, the custodian of such records, and the number of records to be stored. Closed private schools are required to transfer all permanent information contained in student records to the public school district in which the private school was located or to the principal office of the private school system or association of which the private school is a member. It is important to comply with these requirements in order to facilitate access to academic records by former students seeking to continue their education. If your private school is closing at the end of the 2009-10 school year, please contact the Office of Independent Education & Parental Choice at (800) 447-1636.

### New Format for the "Private School Newsletter"

Future editions of the "Private School Newsletter" will be distributed to schools and other parties electronically, through e-mail. Moving to an e-mail only format will not only eliminate costs in materials, printing, handling, and postage, but will also reduce environmental impact by saving paper and other resources involved in the distribution of the newsletter to the over 2,000 private schools throughout Florida. In order to facilitate this change and provide a smooth transition to the new electronic format, please ensure all school e-mail addresses have been entered correctly in your Annual Survey. A school may also update its Contact E-mail address at any time by logging in as a private school administrator on the School Choice Web Site. Under the Administration heading on the left side of the screen, click on the link to "Update Contact Info" and make the appropriate changes. # 2010-2011 Updates Regarding School Immunization Requirements

- Students entering Kindergarten through Grade 2 need documentation of 2 doses of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine;
- Students entering Grades 3 9 need documentation of 1 dose of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine;
- Students entering Grades 7 & 8 need documentation of Tdap (tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis);
- Students entering Kindergarten and Grade 1 need documentation of 2 doses of measles-mumpsrubella (MMR) vaccine.

# **Bright Futures Scholarship Program**

<u>Security:</u> In order for your private school students to earn a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship, your high school must:

- be registered as a private high school with the Florida Department of Education, and
- request, from OSFA, secure access to the Bright Futures Scholarship Program's Evaluation System to submit your high school students' transcripts online for evaluation for a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship. Be sure to indicate at least one senior on your private school annual survey, so your high school will be listed on the required Florida Financial Aid Application.

<u>Web site:</u> Refer students to <u>www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/home/ApplyHere.htm</u> to submit the required *Initial State Student Application*. Refer to <u>www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/acadrequire.htm</u> to view the academic requirements for each Bright Futures Scholarship.

#### Before you go home for the summer:

Please be sure to submit final transcripts with final grades and high school graduation dates to Summer Production for all your seniors who submitted a Florida Financial Aid Application. A standard Florida high school diploma is a requirement for earning a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship. When you indicate the diploma type online, the links "standard" and "accelerated" will direct you to the listing of the coursework required for these diplomas. By checking the radio button next to these links, you are indicating the student has earned a standard Florida high school diploma.

**Webinars:** Sign up for a webinar! These hands on, instructor led, web-based trainings are offered free August through May of each academic year. Sessions for guidance counselors covering eligibility requirements, course table information, state student financial aid database, and private high school online transcript entry & evaluation systems are available.
