SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AND PRIVATE SCHOOL PROPOSED LEGISLATION



The 2009 Florida Legislature will be in session from March 3—May 1, 2009. Presently, there are bills proposed in both the House and the Senate that, if passed by both chambers and approved by the Governor, could affect Florida private schools in general and those participating in the state scholarship programs. The number of each bill, the bill's sponsor, bill subject, and a brief synopsis has been provided for reference.

This bill creates Student Preparedness Pilot Program to include Duval County School District as one of selected school districts; allows students 16 to 18 years of age to terminate school enrollment if they meet pilot program requirements for attendance & completion; provides for nontraditional academic options; provides for study & report by the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability.

HB 33 Representative Ambler Childhood Vaccinations

This bill requires that health care providers disclose information about childhood vaccinations to a minor's parent or legal guardian before vaccinating the minor; requires the Department of Health to develop a standardized form; prohibits a provider from administering a vaccination to a minor until after the minor's parent or guardian signs the form; requires certain health care providers to provide information about childhood vaccines to patients who are pregnant, etc.

<u>SB 76</u> Senator Wilson Juvenile Records

This bill requires each clerk of court to submit information concerning juvenile arrest records to the Department of Law Enforcement; revises the criteria for disseminating criminal justice information; provides for agents of the Department of Juvenile Justice to administer oaths and affirmations; requires that fingerprints and photographs be taken from certain juveniles for use in investigating other violations of law, etc.

SB 82 Senator Wilson Mandatory School Attendance

This bill changes the ending age for mandatory school attendance from 16 to 18 years of age.

SB 92Senator WilsonSchool Attendance/Withdrawing from School

This bill requires that a student who is withdrawing from school be assigned a counselor or other school personnel to provide educational information until the student is 18 years old; requires 9th graders and students who are withdrawing from school to receive instruction about the effects of withdrawing from high school and certain available options.

<u>SB 146</u>	Senator Bullard	School Entry Requirements/Swimming Life Skills	
	This bill requires children who enter public or private schools in the state to present evidence of having completed a class in swimming life skills conducted by a certified instructor; provides for certain exemptions from the requirement, etc.		
<u>SB 194</u>	Senator Wilson	School-entry Health and Vision Examinations	
	This bill requires children who enter public or private schools in the state to present evidence of having received a comprehensive vision examination; requires the imposition of a fee on the retail sale of nonprescription eyeglasses; provides for the fee to be used by the Department of Health to assist parents in paying for school-entry comprehensive vision examinations; requires rules for eligibility for and the distribution of funds, etc.

<u>HB 353</u>	Representative Porth	John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program	
	This bill authorizes students who receive certain services under VPK Program to receive John M. McKay Scholarship; deletes requirement that student must have spent prior school year in attendance at Florida public school or Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind to be eligible for scholarship; provides certain rights & requires information explaining rights & responsibilities; requires DOE to recommend training for school personnel in procedures for safe restraint of students; requires private school to refund scholarship payment under certain circumstances; permits students to receive scholarship services at locations other than private school's site under specified conditions.		
<u>HB 397</u>	Representative Skidmore	Prohibited Discrimination	
	•	based on sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, arital status; defines terms; conforms terminology.	
<u>HB 453</u>	Representative Weatherford	Tax Credits for Contributions to Nonprofit Scholarship-funding Organizations	
	This bill provides for credits against sales & use tax for contributions to eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organizations; expands Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program to include sales & use tax credits & insurance premium tax credits; revises credits for contributions to nonprofit scholarship-funding organizations; specifies that taxpayers' use of credit doesn't reduce alternative minimum tax credits; specifies DOE tax credit scholarship notification requirements; specifies notice requirements & limitations; provides for credits against insurance premium tax for contributions to nonprofit scholarship-funding organizations. <u>CS/HB 453</u> PreK-12 Policy Committee and Weatherford (CO- SPONSORS) Horner; Hudson; Workman; Zapata

<u>SB 610</u>	Senator Wise	Florida Schools of Excellence (FSE)	
	This bill provides the purpose of the Florida Schools of Excellence Commission; provides that the commission may authorize new sources of community support to participate as cosponsors in developing and supporting charter schools; revises the application requirements to sponsor a FSE charter school; provides requirements under which the commission may sponsor a conversion charter school and a FSE charter school, etc.		
<u>SB 916</u>	Senator Wilson	Corporate Tax Credit Scholarship Program	
	This bill provides an additional purpose that enables students in specified grades in public schools to receive certain assistance in attaining grade-level performance; requires scholarship funding organizations to allocate at least 25 percent of their scholarships to public school students; permits scholarships of a certain amount for public school students; requires public schools to account for the use of scholarship funds, etc.		
<u>HB 999</u>	Representative Horner	Educational Choice	
	This bill establishes Class Size Grant Program to provide option to attend public school other than the one to which student is assigned, or to provide class size grant to private school of choice, for students assigned to classrooms that exceed constitutional class size limits; provides eligibility requirements for receipt of grant; provides school district, DOE, & Commissioner of Education obligations & authority; provides eligibility requirements & obligations of private school participating in program; provides for grant funding, reporting, & payment; requires DOE to report on school district implementation of & compliance with program.		
<u>SB 1010</u>	Senator Ring	McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities	
	Similar to HB 353		
	This bill authorizes students who receive certain services under the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program to receive a John M. McKay Scholarship; deletes the requirement that a student must have spent the prior school year in attendance at a Florida public school or the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind to be eligible for a scholarship, etc.		
<u>SB 1310</u>	Senator Gardiner	Tax Credits/Nonprofit Scholarship-funding Organizations	
	Identical to HB 453		
<u>HB 1325</u>	Representative Kriseman	Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program	
	This bill requires students participating in Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program to take FCAT under specified conditions; provides additional requirements for private schools participating in program; revises DOE program obligations; provides additional requirements for teachers employed by or under contract with private schools participating in program.		

<u>HB 1455</u>	Representative Reagan	Childhood Immunizations	
	This bill revises list of required childhood immunizations; provides set of recommended vaccination requirements that address manner & frequency of administration of immunizations for children who are entitled to admittance into kindergarten or any other initial entrance into public or private school in this state.		
<u>SB 1988</u>	Senator Wise	School Choice Pilot Project/Orange County	
	This bill establishes the Education Empowerment Zone Pilot Project in Orange County; provides student eligibility requirements for school choice options, including public school, charter school, private school, and virtual school choice; provides eligibility requirements for receipt of an education empowerment zone grant to attend a private or virtual school; specifies parent and student responsibilities for participation, etc.		
<u>SB 2124</u>	Senator Wise	Educational Choice/Class Size Grant Program	
	Identical to HB 999		
<u>SB 2478</u>	Senator Gardiner	Children with Disabilities	
	Compare to HB 353 and SB 1010		
	This bill requires certain licensing boards to require continuing education on developmental disabilities for certain licensees and certificate holders; requires the DOH to develop and implement a plan to promote awareness of developmental disabilities; authorizes students who receive certain services under the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program to receive a John M. McKay Scholarship, etc.		
<u>SB 2564</u>	Senator Deutch	Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program	
	Similar to HB 1325		
	This bill requires that students who are participating in the Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program take the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test under certain conditions; provides additional requirements for private schools that are participating in the program; revises the DOE's obligations under the program; provides additional requirements for teachers employed by or under contract with private schools that are participating in the program.		
<u>SB 2674</u>	Senator Bennett	Childhood Immunizations	
	This bill revises the list of required childhood immunizations; provides a set of recommended vaccination requirements that address the manner and frequency of administration of immunizations for children who are entitled to admittance into kindergarten or any other initial entrance into a public or private school in this state.		

SB 7050

Proposed Committee Bill Consideration by Education Pre-K - 12 Criminal Background Screenings

This bill revises the terms "child care personnel" and "screening" to specify the personnel who are subject to the screening requirements and conform to changes made by the act; prohibits the DCFS from adopting different background screening standards for facilities that serve different age groups; revises the minimum screening standards for child care personnel, etc.
